What is the judging process?

Winning products are selected by a panel of CRN's top editors. The actual judging process is confidential.

What is the Editors' Choice award and how is it selected?

Each year a single product is selected by CRN editors from the winners of the individual categories and recognized as the most innovative product of the year. We'll vary the process slightly in 2014. We'll invite winners from each category to attend the NexGen Cloud Conference to pitch their winning products before an audience and an editorial panel.
