	d How many students <u>had not</u> obtained the required meningococcal conjugate vaccine? (Not Up to Date) Enter the number of students that had not obtained (received) the second meningococcal vaccine within 30 calendar days. This includes students with no immunization record on file as well as students missing documentation for one or more of the required vaccines. 4	Provisionally Enrolled Of the students reported in question 3d as Not Up to Date, how many were granted provisional enrollment? <u>This option should only be entered if the administration of vaccine in a series of doses given at medically approved intervals requires a period in excess of 30 calendar days.</u> Additional days, upon certification by a physician stating that the standard series is in process, may be allowed to obtain the required immunization. Primarily applies to children on a catch-up schedule.	
5	Excluded Of the students reported in question 3d as Not Up to Date, how many were not permitted to attend school (excluded) after the 30th calendar day? Enter the number of students who were not allowed to attend school (excluded) because they did not meet the state immunization requirements written in NCGS 130A-155
